We are learning...

Maths: This half term, we will be continuing our work on vertical addition and subtraction. We will also be focusing on using jottings and times tables to solve division math stories. Then, we will apply these skills to word problems and other reasoning skills.

Writing: In their writing lessons this half term, children will be focusing on developing their writing skills within various genres. These include an alternative ending, character description, biography and more. Each week, children will be taught writing skills that provide equitable challenge. These can subsequently be used within their independent writing. In Year 2, there is a large focus on coherence, drawing upon wider vocabulary, punctuating correctly and developing logical sentence structures.

Science: This topic brings together the study of living things, habitats and growing plants. It is strongly focused on outdoor learning and investigations. All lessons will be underpinned by 'working scientifically' opportunities – allowing our pupils to make real-life links to careers and bring the curriculum alive.

History: Children will be learning about seaside holidays in the 1950s. Within this, we will improve our historical skills by comparing how things have changed.

RE: Children will continue to develop their understanding of texts of Christianity and Islam: The Bible and The Qur'an; children will discover why these books matter most, in the religions they are learning about.

DT: This half term, children will be creating a moving vehicle by researching and evaluating a range of vehicles that they have seen. They will learn about wheels, chassis and axles in order to help them build their own.

PSHE: We are going to focus on healthy eating and how it helps our bodies. We will even be following a healthy recipe to make a yummy healthy snack!
