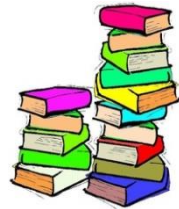

## Our Topic

This term we will be exploring the new season of Spring. We will be starting the term off with looking at a book called Hello Spring. Together we will explore what the signs of Spring are and the changes to the environment. We are also very lucky and are going to be looking after some chicken eggs during this time. Together we will look at the life cycle of a chicken egg and get to observe our eggs hatch and grow! Alongside this we will be looking at our key text 'egg to chicken'. In addition to this, we are also having a visit from The Farm on Wheels!

Following this, we will be focusing on Jack and the beanstalk! Our focus will be on how beanstalks grow, exploring the life cycle of a plant and identifying features of a plant. During this period, we will be identifying seeds, growing our own plants and discovering how to care and look after our environment. We will also be identifying who the characters are and exploring the plot of this traditional tale.

Our final topic of this term is Easter. We will be looking at why Christians celebrate Easter and taking part in some Easter traditions, such as an Easter egg hunt, decorating eggs and trying hot cross buns!
