ENGLISH

This term our class reading book is 'The Viking Boy' by Tony Bradman.

Our Writing genres are:

- Narrative – Adventure
- Newspaper Report - Lindisfarne
- Persuasive Letter

Our Reading lessons will concentrate on reading domains of:

- Word meaning
- Retrieval
- Inference



PSHE

MATHS

This term we will include:

COMPUTING

In this unit, pupils research examples of art gallery architecture, before using Trimble SketchUp to create their own virtual gallery. Finally, they use the gallery to exhibit their own artwork.

GEOGRAPHY

In this unit, the children learn about the Alpine region of Europe, how the Alps were formed and how homes are adapted to the climate. They create a storyboard on mountain formation, design an Alpine home, and produce literature for visitors to the area using geographical vocabulary.

MUSIC



This term we will listen and appraise a Pop Ballad and recognise the basic style indicators, starting with 'Make you feel my love'. Children will learn to play classroom instruments and sing.

SCIENCE

This term is to understand movement, forces, and magnets. We will learn how to explain that unsupported objects fall towards the Earth because of the force of gravity acting between the Earth and the falling object. We will also identify scientific evidence that has been used to support or refute ideas or arguments.
