Year 6 Spring 1 Curriculum Leaflet

ENGLISH

During English lessons children will performing poetry with guidance from Pep the Poet. Children will be discussing the different structural and language features and how to deliver a performance. In addition, we will be exploring a range of text features such as metaphors, similes, alliteration, and the impact they have on the reader. Children will also be drawing inspiration from the Titanic. We will unpick what really happened and how the disaster could have been prevented.

RE

This half term, we will be exploring the connections between religious teachings and religious charities.

GEOGRAPHY

In this unit, the children will consider if we are damaging our world and how we can protect it. The children will investigate energy production, the oceans and minerals, as well as conducting an enquiry into how the school can become more sustainable.

PSHE

In this module we will look at how to respect ourselves and others. Discussing how hard it can be to develop relationships and the pitfalls that we may encounter.



ART

In this unit, children will look at a range of sculpted artworks, predominantly focussing on ceramic vases. Children will research and develop their own design for a vase and create one using modelling clay.
