ENGLISH

This term our class reading book is 'Kensuke's Kingdom' by Michael Morpurgo.

Our Writing genres are:

PSHE

MATHS

This term we will include:

- Converting fractions into decimals and percentages.
- 2D and 3D shapes
- Multi-step word problems.
- Division (short method)

FRENCH

This term we will be learning to talk about mine and my family's birthdays and give opinions. Key vocabulary includes: Janvier, Février, Mars, Avril, Mai, Juin, Juillet, Août, Septembre, Octobre, Novembre and Décembre, L'anniversaire and Mon anniversaire.

RE

This term, we will be looking at Christianity. We will be looking at different stories within the Bible, the New Testament and the Old Testament and how the stories effect the way Christians live.

GEOGRAPHY

In this unit, children will find out about the UK's global trade links, investigating where everyday products come from and the journeys they take to our homes. They will also map the journeys taken by items, and research the pros and cons of buying local or imported goods.

MUSIC

This term we will listen and appraise 'Dancing in the Street'. This will include Listen & Appraise, new progressive Warm-up Games, Flexible Games, new progressive improvisation resources, and composing.



SCIENCE

In this topic, children look at and describe the changes as humans develop to old age. Pupils draw a timeline to indicate stages in the growth and development of humans and learn about the changes experienced in puberty.



COMPUTING

In this unit, pupils create an interactive, non-linear adventure game. They make this as a set of interlinked slides using hyperlinks in presentation software; the player chooses their own path.
