Year 4 Summer 2 Curriculum Leaflet

ENGLISH

In writing, we will explore a range of genres, from persuasive pieces to author Q&As. Children will also take part in a visit around Bilston, which they will use as inspiration for a piece of descriptive writing.

We will continue to focus on Expanded noun phrases, conjunctions, speech punctuation and emotive language.

There will also be a strong emphasis on editing and improving written work, helping children to become more reflective and independent writers

RE

In RE, children will be looking at Identity and Belonging. They will learn about why it is important to belong to a Global Community and why our identity is important.

HISTORY

In History, children will explore how and why Crime and Punishment has changed over time. They will use a variety of sources to understand the different time periods. Children will learn about the Bloody Code of 1815, the founding of the first police force, transportation of prisoners and the activism of the Suffragettes.

PSHE

In PSHE, our topic is 'Dreams and Goals' We will be exploring what dreams the children have for the future, how they can achieve them and planning for the future. They will also discuss how to adapt when we don't reach our goals.

SCIENCE

In Science, children will learn about building towers and bridges, starting with constructing tall towers, then exploring bridges. They will look at animals as builders and engage in researching famous engineers and architects and the structures that they built.

MATHS

In maths, year 4 will be looking at a range of arithmetic and reasoning topics, with opportunities to use and apply their knowledge. Our units this half term include:

- Multiplying 2-digit and 3-digit numbers together using the grid method
- Measuring mass and capacity using tools and converting measurements
- Interpreting data in bar charts
- Identifying lines of symmetry in shapes drawn on grids
- Drawing shapes on a grid and using a mirror line to show the reflections.
- Translating objects on grids and describing the movement using directional language

COMPUTING

The children will be looking at the different ways we track and measure weather and how this can be recorded and analysed using data management software.
